Neighborhood Groups

The Village's Neighborhood Groups have been up and running since last October when Tierrasanta was divided up into seven groups. They are formed according to where our Villagers live in proximity to one another. Our purpose lies with Captains who are willingly available as a source of information about events at the Village and a resource for help when help is needed.

The individuals who are in those groups have most likely already been contacted with information on how they may reach the Captain of their neighborhood Village group. A list of the individual groups, the residents in the group, and Captains' phone numbers have been provided on a separate sheet as an attachment with the Vibes. Please feel free to contact the Captain in your group for any information you may need.

The Captains of the Neighborhood groups met on January the 29th to discuss the various aspects of the service they are providing. The accompanying photo shows those Captains who were present at our gathering. We continue to define and redefine with questions like: "How much do the members of our groups wish to be contacted?" "How often should we check in when we have not heard from a member"? Unless we hear from you otherwise, it was decided that your Captain will contact you approximately three times during the calendar year. We constantly discuss the element of not wanting to be intrusive yet still wanting our Village neighbors to know we are there as a source of information or help when help is needed. We have appreciated some of the feedback we have received and continue to encourage members to call when they need clarification on how we can assist.

Above all is our desire to be there for one another. Please let your Captain know when you have a concern of your own or about one of your Village neighbors. The Chart of Groups is attached to member's e-mail Vibes.

Through her company, "Adventures by the Book," McBeth, 57, of Tierrasanta, plans events that range from a candy-tasting party with food blogger and author Sally McKenney to a literary tea with San Diegan Michelle Gable, author of "I'll See You in Paris."

For those with literary wanderlust, she also leads readers on tours through the U.S. and abroad. Readers catch crab with Alaskan wilderness author and photographer Lynn Schooler or trace the novel "Lisette's List" through Paris and Provence with author Susan Vreeland.

McBeth, who drew on her background in event planning and bookselling to start her company, discusses how she combines books, food and travel to enrich the reading experience.

Q: What are any benefits or fundraisers you participate in?

A: Because I live in the community, I developed a "Tierrasanta Talks" program for the Tierrasanta Village, a memberbased support group for seniors that regularly features authors of interest, inspiration or renown. These events not only raise a bit of money, but they offer an opportunity for our community to connect, once again, through books. After the Paris attacks in 2015, I helped organize Je Suis Paris, a fundraiser to benefit the French Red Cross. We invited seven authors to participate, whose books take place in Paris, and together, we raised almost \$6,000 in just eight days.

Q: What's the best advice you ever received?

A: Life is an adventure to be lived, not a problem to be solved.

CARR Presentation

On February 16, a group of Villages and their guests, heard an excellent presentation by Chrisy Selder, Co-Founder of **CARR (Consumer Advocates for Care Reform).** The mission of this local non -profit advocacy group is to improve residential care in assisted living facilities by educating consumers and increasing industry accountability. The topic of the presentation was: Using Public Documents: Informing Your Assisted Living Choices.

Many times, families are faced with making a snap decision about a care facility upon dismissal of a loved one from the hospital. Our speaker strongly advised that we do our homework in advance of such an emergency.

In beginning your research, the following resources are available, where you may review source documents pertaining to compliance, inspections, complaints, license, evaluations, and other important information on specific care facilities.
